9. Information Sharing	Brendan reported that CHW is working with Victorian Government to reduce emissions as all Victorian Government authorities have to frame their plan to achieve zero emissions by 2050. Craig Whiteford and Ross commented on the good uptake of the Take2Pledge campaign. There are 2 types of operational pledges which apply to government partners. The launch of foundation members will occur next month. Committee for Ballarat are aiming to get 100 members to sign up to the pledge. Anticipating that 30 of the 79 councils will sign up. 	Quenton reported that the City of Ballarat won a Storm Water Victoria prize for the Green Blue Action Plan, with its designs for streetscape renewals in Ballarat CBD and other areas embracing best practice in urban forestry and storm water management.	
	Rosemary Reported that GCWWRRG will be moving to rear of CHW offices at end of Augustand that GCWWRRG will be hosting the Victorian Waste Education Strategy Conference on 25 August.	
	Craig reported that Federation University is now encompassing the Berwick Campus. Federation University through its implementation of the International Corporate Social Responsibility framework have won the role of hosting a conference I Melbourne in September.	
	Craig Whiteford mentioned that workshops were held for local government on climate change adaptation themes in Ballarat and Horsham. Key findings were that planning officers need more authority and support and councillors need to be better educated on implications of their planning decisions. Councils recognised that they need to use alliances to engage with communities over climate change.	
	Hazen flagged that ACOSS (Aust Council of Social Services) have conducted a benchmarking process for resilient organisations, indicating 25% of community organisations would fail to deliver under an extreme weather event. It was suggested that Imogen Yates at Fed Uni is conducting a post grad study on these issues. Hazen gave an update on the Brown Hill Community Fire Aware Network. With assistance from CHW and Ballarat Partnership Grants the network now has stickers on letterboxes, regular newsletters and a web and facebook presence.	
	Ian suggested that rather than each group reporting verbally on their organisation's projects, strategies, structures and activities; it would be more beneficial for this information to be circulated via the newly created RSAB E-news.
